## New system launch - instructions for seminarians

You will need to set a new password when you first log in, as your existing password will not work. Here is how to do this:

1) At the new login page, do not enter your current login details but instead click the blue 'forgot your password?' link (red rectangle):

## London Reformed Baptist Seminary

The LRBS part-time seminary opened in 1975 and this online facility was added in 2011 to make the course accessible to people living outside the UK. From October 2014 the two courses have merged making the online course available to people in the UK for the first time.

Those accepted on the online course as auditors can download recordings of LRBS seminars and follow the reading course (there is no charge for this).

Those who wish to do so can also submit assignments. Feedback on these will be provided by an assignment tutor (there is a modest charge for this, waived for those in full-time Christian service).






3) You will then be emailed a link to set a new password - click the link within email that you receive. (NB if you have not received this, please check your spam or junk folder.)

4) This will take you to a screen where you can set your new password. Enter a strong password (letters, numbers and symbols) and click 'Save Password.'

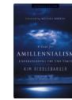

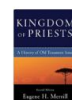

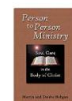
